# Hazel's Pullover Bib

Skill Level: Advanced Beginner

**Size:** Fits 13-16 inch head circumference. Bib is 7 inches X 7 inches.

#### **Materials**

- Approximately 3oz worsted weight cotton (I prefer Hobby Lobby's I Love This Cotton or Cotton Tots)
- Size H & I Crochet Hooks
- Yarn Needle



#### **Abbreviations**

R - round or row depending on the direction of work	dc - double crochet
cscf - Chainless Single Crochet Foundation	st – stitch
ch – chain	sts – stitches
sl – slip stitch	rep – repeat dnc - do not count
sc – single crochet	BLO – back loops only

## **Top Section**

**NOTE:** If you want the opening for the head to be larger, just make your foundation chain/row longer. The actual bib section will be worked over the same number of stitches.

R1 leaving a tail about 5", cscf for 54 sts, join with a sl st through back loops of 1st sc, being careful not to twist. (54 sts) (I use the tail to sew the bottom of the row 1st and last stitches of R1 together.)

**OR R1using a size I hook for this row only**, ch 54, join with a sl st, being careful not to twist; sc in joining st and each st around, join with sl st to 1st sc. **Change to H hook.** (54 sts)

R2-3 Using size H hook, ch 1 (dnc), and working in BLO, sc same st as ch 1 and in each st around, join with a sl st through back loops of 1st sc. DO NOT FASTEN OFF.


#### **Bib Section**

**NOTE**: You will be working only on the first 25 stitches, turning project at the end of rows.



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- R4 (Right side) ch 1 (dnc), using BLO, sc same st as join, sc next 24 sts, turn. (25 sts)
- R5 (Wrong side) ch 1 (dnc), sc same st, (working in the **bottom** front loop ONLY, sc next 24 sts), sc last st (work under both loops), turn. (25 sts) (see photo below)



R6 (Right side) ch 1 (dnc), sc same st, in next st you will be working a dc in the row below, under the loops created in previous row (do not work st behind dc), (sc next st, work dc in the loops of the row below) to last st, sc last st, turn. (see photo below)



- R7 Repeat R5.
- R8 ch 1 (dnc), sc same st, sc next st, in next st you will be working a dc in the row below, under the loops created in previous row (do not work st behind dc); (sc next st, work dc in the loops of the row below) to last 2 sts, sc last 2 sts, turn.
- R9-24 Repeat R6-8, ending with R6. Fasten off and weave ends.

### **Optional Border**

Join yarn at the top where the bib and top section meet with a sl st, ch 1, sc same st, sc evenly down side of bib, 2 sc in last stitch for corner, sc through BLO across bottom, 2 sc in last stitch for corner, sc evenly up side, join to top with sl st, fasten off and weave ends.

# Hazel's Face Cloth

**Size:** Cloth is 8 inches X 8 inches.

#### **Materials**

 Approximately 3oz worsted weight cotton (I prefer Hobby Lobby's I Love This Cotton or Cotton Tots)

**NOTE:** if you use a lighter weight cotton yarn you may need to lengthen cloth-I made 29 rows, ending with R5.)

- Size H & I Crochet Hooks
- Yarn Needle
- R1 (Right side) **With size I hook**, ch 25, turn; working in back bumps of ch (for a nicer edge), sc in **first** ch from hook, sc in next ch and each ch to end, turn. **Change to H hook.** (25 sts)
- R2 (Wrong side) ch 1 (dnc), sc same st, (working in the **bottom** front loop ONLY, sc next 23 sts), sc last st, turn. (25 sts) (see photo above)
- R3 (Right side) ch 1 (dnc), sc same st, in next st work a dc in the row below, under the loops created in previous row (do not work st behind dc); (sc next st, work dc in the loops of the row below) to last st, sc last st, turn. (see photo above)
- R4 Ch 1 (dnc), sc same st, working in **bottom** front loop ONLY, sc next 23 sts, sc last st, turn. (25 sts)
- R5 ch 1 (dnc), sc same st, sc next st, in next st work a dc in the row below, under the loops created in previous row (do not work st behind dc); (sc next st, work dc in the loops of the row below) to last 2 sts, sc last 2 sts, turn.
- R6-26 Repeat R3-5, ending with R5. Do not fasten off if working border in same color. Otherwise, fasten off and weave ends.

### **Optional Border**

Join yarn in any st; sc around cloth, making 3 sc in each corner. If you're using the same color, make 3 sc in last st completed, continue around cloth, making 3 sc in each corner. Fasten off and weave ends.

# **Optional Flower**

Using magic ring, (or ch 3 and join) \*ch 2, 2 dc in ring, ch 2, sl st in ring, rep from \* 4 more times for a 5-petaled flower. Tighten ring, fasten off, leaving a longer tail for sewing flower onto cloth/bib.
