

One Skein Cowl



Materials;

- ▼ 100g of aran weight yarn. Here one skein (100g) of Malabrigo Worsted 100% merino yarn has been used in Milonga
- **♥** 5mm hook

Stitches used;

slst = slip stitch ch = chain sc = single crochet cluster

Abbreviations;

rpt = repeat frm = from rnd = round

Gauge;

13 stitches and 13 rows = $10 \text{cm} \times 10 \text{cm}$ square using single crochet

Finished size;

37cm x 16cm when folded in half (enough to fit over your head once)




Chain 90, join with slst to beginning ch.

Rnd 1;

ch1, 1sc in each ch around to end joining with slst to first sc (90 sts)



Rnd 2; ch2, work 1 cluster in same place and in each sc around as follows;



- 1. Yarn round hook.
- 2. Insert hook in to the stitch, yarn round hook and pull through loop (3 loops on hook).
- 3. Yarn round hook again, insert hook in to the same space, yarn round hook and pull though loop (5 loops on hook).
- 4. Yarn round hook and pull through all 5 loops on hook.

Continue by working 1 cluster in each sc around. Join the round with a slst in to the top of the beginning 2 ch. (90 sts)

Rnd 3;

ch1, 1sc in same space. 1sc in each cluster around joining with slst to first sc. (90 sts)

Rpt rows 2 and 3 a further 8 times or until you've ran out of yarn.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

For a more textured look, simply turn the cowl inside out.

Ta-dah! You made your very own One Skein Cowl! Perfect for that winter weather...



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
